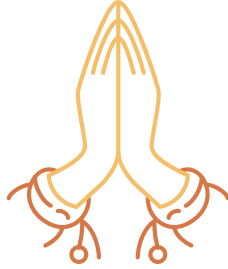

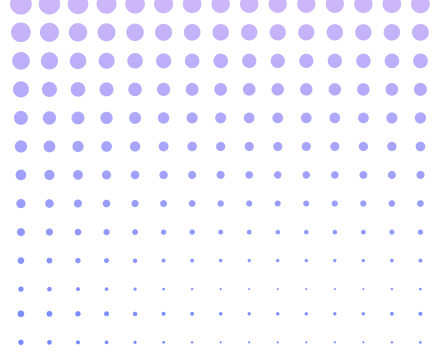

Warangal, Telangana is a city rich in history and culture. It is known for its grand monuments, ancient temples, and diverse festivals.

History

- Warangal was the capital of the Kakatiya rulers for more than 200 years (1163 CE TO 1323 CE).
- The city's name comes from the Telugu word Orugallu, which means "carved out of single rock".
- The Kakatiyas built many grand monuments and architectural wonders, including the Warangal Fort, Swayambhu Temple, and Ramappa Temple.
- The city's architecture is influenced by many different dynasties, including the Kakatiyan Dynasty.

Culture

- Warangal celebrates many festivals, including Holi, Diwali, Dussera, Raksha Bandhan, Ram Navami, Vinayak Chavithi, Makar Sankranti, Ugadi, Christmas, Ramadan, Eid-Ul-Fitr, Eid al-Adha, Milad-un-Nabi, and Moharram.
- The city is known for its floral festival of Bathukamma, where women worship the goddess with different flowers for nine days.

The Institute currently has thirteen academic departments and advanced research centres in various disciplines of engineering, pure sciences and management, with nearly 100 laboratories organized in a unique pattern of functioning, Central Library with state of the art facilities, Auditorium, Student Activity Centre, Centre for Digital Infrastructure and Services (CDIS), Indoor Games Complex, Stadium, Seminar Halls with state of the art infrastructure, Health Centre and Dispensary etc. Faculty of repute, brilliant student community, excellent technical and supporting staff and an effective administration have all contributed to the pre-eminent status of NIT Warangal.

Reaching NIT Warangal

The NIT campus is situated approximately 2 kilometers from the Kazipet railway station, 10 kilometers from Warangal railway station and about 5 kilometers from the Hanamkonda bus station.

To and From the Campus

Bus: Kazipet and Hanamkonda are the main bus stands near the campus, offering easy access to the NIT Warangal Main Gate. Buses from major locations like Hyderabad and other cities in Telangana frequently stop at these points. The nearest major bus terminal is at Hanamkonda located approximately 4 kilometers from the campus. Buses are available from the Mahatma Gandhi Bus Station (MGBS) in Hyderabad and every 15 minutes Buses are available from Uppal X Roads at Hyderabad. For the visa processing, you need to submit the following documents in an online FRRO portal For FRRO registration:

Required Documents

1. Valid Passport: Original passport with a minimum validity of six months.
2. Visa: Original visa issued by the Indian embassy or consulate (if applicable).
3. Completed Application Form: FRRO application form, duly filled and signed.
4. Recent Passport-Sized Photos: Four recent passport-sized photos.
5. Proof of Address: Utility bills (electricity, water, gas), rent agreement, or lease deed.
6. Proof of Financial Resources: Bank statements, income proof, or sponsorship letter.
7. Travel Documents: Flight itinerary, travel tickets, or a copy of the boarding pass.
8. Health Certificate: Medical certificate from a recognized hospital or medical institution.
9. Proof of Education: Degree certificates, transcripts, or diplomas (for students).
10. Proof of Employment: Employment contract, salary slips, or a letter from the employer (for working professionals).
